RESIDENT FAQs

Why are the contractors on site so many days before the event?

Due to the scale of the event, it is necessary to have an appropriate amount of time and days to build the concert arena and facilities to accommodate the audience safely.

Why is the pathway to the rear of the stage on the promenade closed?

The pathway is required to be closed during part of the build and de-rig when the event is operational to maintain a safe environment for the general public.

Will there be access to the RNLI Station and Ribble Cruising Club during the concerts?

The RNLI and Ribble Cruising Club maintain ongoing communication with Lytham Festival and arrangements have been made to allow them access to the festival premises. Additionally, the RNLI has provisions to access the lifeboat house promptly for emergencies or other urgent needs. For any questions regarding access please contact these organisations directly.

Will the council have enforcement and support officers in the area?

The council will have a number of employees available throughout the festival including trading standards, environmental enforcement officers, waste management teams, health and safety, building control, tourism and parks staff.

Will there be an additional police present?

Yes, Lytham Festival pay for an additional Police presence during the concerts.

Will there be fireworks?

There will be no fireworks during the shows, however, please note that pyrotechnic effects will be in use on some shows.

Are vehicles allowed to park overnight in the dedicated car parks on The Green?

Cars are not permitted to stay overnight.

Are camper vans allowed to park on The Green overnight during the festival?

No, Motorhomes, caravans, or camper vans are not permitted to park overnight in the designated festival car parks.

Who arranges and pays for any repair/reinstatement to The Green if there is any damage?

Lytham Festival organises and pays for reinstatement works to begin as soon as The Green is clear of event infrastructure. This is completed under the supervision of Fylde Borough Council's parks team.

KEY INFORMATION

CONCERT ARENA

The main concert arena preparations will begin on Monday 22nd June with all work finished by Saturday 11th July.

The site opening times are 08:00 - 20:00.

Please note there will be load out activity and essential site maintenance throughout the night and directly after each event. This includes site activity, stage activity and litter picking. All crew are briefed to keep the noise to a minimum.

SOUND

Lytham Festival has a stringent noise management policy in place which is managed by an independent noise management company. If you do have any queries regarding noise during the event please contact the resident phone line.

FOOTPATH CLOSURES

The footpath along the beach will be closed from 08:00 Tuesday 23rd June re-opening by 17:00 on Friday 10th July. We hope you understand and appreciate that while the closure may interrupt your routine walks and cycle rides, it is in the overall best interest of maintaining a safe environment for the general public.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AND TRANSPORT

TRACSIS Event Traffic Management is contracted by the festival to manage all car parking and traffic management and signage for the duration of the festival (<https://tracsistraffic.com/>)

ROAD CLOSURES

To provide a sterile area for emergency evacuation there will be a road closure in place on concert days.

This will be in place from 16:00 on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday to allow time for local school pick-ups. The closure will be effective from 15:00 on Saturday and Sunday.

This will not only serve as an evacuation area, but will also create a safe area for the audience to access and exit the event. The road closure location can be found on the resident map. Due to road closures a diversion will be in place for vehicles. Temporary no waiting cones will also be placed to help alleviate any potential congestion that may be caused by these closures during the same periods.

RESIDENT ZONES

As in previous years, Lytham Festival will have a resident parking zone in place. There will be three designated areas: the Blue Zone, Orange and Purple Zones.

Blue Zone: Parking and access is restricted to Blue Zone permit holders only, between 13:00 and 23:59 on each concert day. On Dicconson Terrace, Henry Street and Green Street it is restricted between 15:00 - 23:59 on each concert day.

Orange Zone: Parking and access are restricted to Orange Zone permit holders only, between 10:00 and 23:59 on each concert day. In addition, Lancashire Police require that vehicles parked in this zone must not be moved between 21:30 and 23:59 (or when the road closure is lifted). Outside of these hours, vehicles should only be moved when absolutely necessary.

Purple Zone: New for 2026, residents in the Purple Zone may park and access this area until 13:00 on each concert day. From 13:00 until 23:59, all vehicles need to be removed from this zone. Residents within the Purple Zone only will be provided with access to a parking area within the event car parks on Lytham Green and must move their vehicles there by 13:00 on each concert day.

Residents and businesses within these zones will receive a letter providing more detailed information about the zones and how to apply for permits.

ONE WAY

Following feedback from residents, Fylde Council and the Lytham Festival Residents' Focus Group, for 2026 we will continue the one-way system on Warton Street and Queen Street. For 2026, we will also trial a one-way system on Westby Street as detailed on the map.

Warton Street: Traffic will flow one-way clockwise on Warton Street. The diversion route supporting this will use Park View Road and Mythop Road where traffic measures will be in place to allow cars to pass in both directions.

This will be in place from 15:00 - 23:59 on all concert days.

Queen Street: The one-way system will prioritise traffic flow for the festival buses which use Queen Street as part of their return route to pick up festival-goers from the festival bus stop located on Central Beach.

This will be in place from 15:00 - 23:59 on all concert days.

Westby Street: Traffic will flow clockwise on Westby Street. This will be in place from 15:00 - 23:59 on all concert days.

NO WAITING / NO PARKING / NO UNLOADING

No Waiting / No Parking / No Unloading cones will be placed on numerous roads throughout Lytham on concert days. These locations are marked with yellow lines and cones on the map on the reverse of the guide.

The purpose of these cones is to keep traffic flowing smoothly and to maintain clear access for emergency service vehicles, as parked or unloading vehicles can make it difficult for two-way traffic to pass. These measures will also support more efficient public transport at the end of the event, helping attendees leave Lytham quickly and safely.

BATH STREET AND DICCONSON TERRACE CAR PARK

Bath Street car park will be closed for the duration of the build, show days, and the festival break from 22nd June to 11th July. Dicconson Terrace Car Park will be closed on concert days only.

SECURITY BARRIERS

As part of the traffic management plan, there will be security barrier gates at Lytham Festival. The first barrier will be located on Central Beach (near the Assembly Rooms) and the other on East Beach (near St John the Divine Church). The barriers are installed for the safety and security of all concert goers and residents. The gates will be manned by the police during each concert. Access through the barriers during concert times is restricted to essential vehicles only. Residents will not be able to pass through these barriers at any time unless access is required for an emergency.

The barriers will be installed on Monday 29th June between 19:00 - 21:00 and removed on Monday 6th July between 19:00 - 21:00 during which time there will be temporary diversions in place to allow for the safe installation of each barrier which is estimated to take 1.5 - 2 hours per barrier.

The barriers will remain in the fix open position allowing traffic to flow freely until closure is required for the concerts.

CAR PARKS

Car parking is available on The Green for concert attendees who have purchased a car parking ticket.

Overnight parking and camping are not permitted. The car parks will open daily at 15:00 and close at midnight, or once the last vehicle has exited - whichever comes first.

Fencing barriers around the car parks will be installed on Tuesday 30th June and removed on Monday 6th July. During the day, designated passing points and openings will be maintained to allow residents and visitors normal access to the promenade footpath.

Please note that the public toilet facilities next to the Windmill will remain open throughout the setup, event days, and dismantling period, following their usual opening hours.

PARK AND RIDE

The Park and Ride will be situated at South Promenade Green, St Annes, FY8 1NP (near the Beach Café).

Buses for the Park and Ride service will be provided by Blackpool Transport.

The Park and Ride will open at 14:00, with the first bus departing for the festival at 14:15.

All Park and Ride infrastructure will be set up on Tuesday 30th June and removed by Tuesday 7th July.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

We want to make getting to Lytham Festival easier and reduce traffic at the site. That's why we're offering alternative travel options with our partners: The Big Green Coach, Blackpool Transport and Preston Bus for the festival flyers.

Lytham Festival is working with Northern Rail to strengthen rail services during the festival. New for 2026, an extra late-night service will now operate on Sunday in addition to the timetabled service on all other concert days. Additional details will be shared through our website and social media channels, and ticket holders will be informed ahead of the festival.

SHUTTLE BUSES (THE FESTIVAL FLYER)

At the end of each concert, event customers can easily access dedicated bus services. Buses heading to St Annes and Blackpool depart from West Beach, and those heading to Preston leave from East Beach.

Both are a short walk from the event arena to provide an efficient way to travel home at the end of the night.

These services are subsidised by the festival.

OFFICIAL FESTIVAL PICK UP AND DROP OFF POINT & TAXIS

During the festival concert days, Lowther Pavilion will serve exclusively as the official pick-up and drop-off point for taxis and private vehicles. The Lowther Pavilion car park will be closed to the public on these days.
